1. Introduction

This course deals with the roles of political parties in modern democracies. Another topic of this course is congress. Congress is one of the core branches in democracies. Students delve into several basic questions regarding congress: What does congress do? What roles does congress play in democracies? What is the relationship between political party and congress? Students learn concepts and theories regarding political party and congress. Based on the concepts and theories, we discuss representation and democracy.

2. Course Objectives

After taking this course, students will understand the followings:

1. Basic concepts and theories regarding political party and congress
2. The origins and structures of political party and congress
3. The roles and functions of political party and congress in democracies
4. Analyzing social phenomenon with scientific methods

3. Class types and activities

1. Students are required to read all reading materials and actively participate in class discussions.
2. Students are supposed to take two in-class exams. The exams can include both essay and short answer questions.
3. There will be pop-up quizzes and homework assignments. No make-up quiz or homework assignment is allowed.
4. Students should write a project paper. This paper should be original.
5. Students also need to present their project in class. Details about this assignment will be announced in class.
6. All of the requirements should be done in English. I do not grade your English but do expect you to submit your exam, quizz, and paper written in decent English.
